March's guest speaker was Breanne Yacobucci from Tweed Marijuana Inc. Tweed is a supplier of medical Marijuana and works in conjunction with medical professionals to treat a variety of ailments, including pain, nausea and convulsions, using the primary components of Marijuana, THC & CBD.

These two compounds have significantly different affects and different varieties of the plant produce different levels of each component. The variety prescribed depends on the needs of the patient's condition, and what is most effective to treat the symptoms that they may be experiencing.

In my opinion, the movement to decriminalize the medical use of drugs allows us to more effectively examine their benefits. We've used morphine for years for extreme pain relief but its counterpart heroin has caused a lot of problems and so we have tried to control it. As a general observation though, the war on drugs has been a colossal and expensive failure with big money going to illegal operations and where there is a lot of money at stake, there is a lot of violence as well.

Drug addiction should be treated as any illness and drugs provided to addicts while they get treatment and counselling to get off them. Less dangerous drugs, like Marijuana, could be legalized, regulated and taxed to reduce law enforcement expenses trying to control them and provide revenue for the treatment of addicts. Less expense, more revenue, better treatment for addicts, it is a formula other countries have used with great benefit. When something is not illegal, this even reduces the allure for some people and maybe they don't get caught up in the problem to start with.

His objectives this time are:

To review historical outcomes for external beam radiotherapy for prostate cancer

## Last General Meeting, Tuesday, March 8th, 2016



Breanne Yacobucci, a Community
Engagement Worker for Tweed Marijuana Inc.
will discuss Access to Medical Marijuana.

Tweed is a licensed marijuana producer based in Smith Falls, ON and approved by *Health Canada* to supply medical cannabis to individuals with prescriptions. "Better by Tweed" offers locations in Hamilton, Guelph and Etobicoke that provide free information and support to anyone going through the process of accessing medical cannabis.

Breanne provided some valuable insight to the benefits of Marijuana in treating certain conditions. Marijuana has two primary components, THC & CBD and there are varieties that are high in one component or the other.

The variety selected for treatment depends on the condition you are treating. Cannabis has been used during cancer treatment to reduce nausea after chemo and radiation. It has been found to reduce some forms of cancer pain and help improve appetite for some people undergoing treatment. It is also useful in palliative care, providing the same benefits.

Plants high in THC provide the Euphoric effects and are useful as an analgesic and to treat nausea and seizures and spasticity. The CBD component is non-euphoric and has attributes that are anti-inflammatory, neuro-protective, anti-psychotic and anti-anxiety in nature.

Relative to the past, the application for medical treatment has been streamlined so a form signed by a medical practitioner and submitted to a licensed supplier is all you need to get started. There are even specialized Cannabis clinics that evaluate and prescribe it now.

At present, while the benefits are recognized, the cost is not covered under most insurance plans so you would need to shoulder the cost yourself. Marijuana can be purchased as seeds which can be eaten or vaporized and in an oil format that can be added to food. The product arrives via Canada Post and no more than a 30 day supply can be ordered at one time.


