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PCCN Brampton News

For those who haven't heard, Jim and Sandi Dorsey are back in Canada. Sandi still faces serious hurdles on her road to recovery at the Brampton Civic Hospital. Our best wishes go out to Jim and Sandi during a prolonged difficult period.

In May, Dr. Calvin Law, director of the Odette Cancer Centre came out to speak at our monthly meeting. He provided some additional insights into the various programs at Sunnybrook Hospital. These include the Patient/Family Advisory Council of which our own Paul Henshall is a member. This council serves as a communication interface between hospital staff, patients and community members in an attempt to improve overall patient care and services.

Sunnybrook Hospital was built shortly after the Second World War and has grown substantially since then. It now supports around 250,000 patient visits per year with 6,000 major cancer surgeries. It is one of the major cancer research centres in Canada with studies proceeding to improve both the timing and effectiveness of Radiotherapy treatment for prostate cancer patients among many other initiatives.

One of their most promising initiatives is MR guided Radiotherapy where tumours can be easily seen and directly treated while providing immediate feedback to the doctor providing the treatment. Using this method, one doctor was able to treat over 30 individual brain tumours during a single session with little or no overlap to non cancerous tissue.

By exactly treating the actual tumours with higher dosages of radiation, the cancer can be destroyed in less time with far fewer side effects. This is better for both the patient and the health care system as costs can be reduced as well.

This is our annual the End of the Year Potluck and Social Evening.


Please bring your favourite recipe and a good appetite. Our members always put on a great spread for this evening; no one goes away hungry.

Dr. Calvin Law - Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre

Dr. Law attended the University of Toronto's Medical School and completed his degree in 1994. His clinical practice is devoted to Hepatobiliary, Pancreatic and Gastrointestinal Surgical Oncology. His research is focused on health services research, related to the delivery of care and outcomes in patients with surgically treatable cancer.

He leads the team at Sunnybrook, which includes Dr. Loblaw, with the goal of improving cancer treatments and where possible making them more cost effective as well.

MR guided Radiotherapy, one of their most promising new procedures, includes a combination of new equipment and MR guided treatment methodologies including the Gamma Knife, MR Linac and MR Guided Brachytherapy.

These new procedures allow a doctor to provide highly focused treatment of cancer tumours. This in turn allows for higher dosages and reduces treatment time as well as reducing the more common side effects of radiotherapy. In combination with HIFU, MR can actually measure the relative temperature of a treated tumour to insure that the treatment is effective. MR Guided Brachytherapy allows doctors to very accurately place the tiny radioactive seeds directly into the active tumours for maximum effectiveness.

One can think of Radiotherapy much like a magnifying glass where the focal point of the beam is destructive whereas areas outside of the focal point are much less affected. MR Guidance makes sure that this focal point is maintained on the exact areas to be treated.

At the same time new MR technologies may soon even be able to highlight the more aggressive tumours allowing doctors to focus on the areas of greatest risk to the patient.

Dr. Law also provided us with interesting facts about the construction of some of the new treatment facilities that require specially reinforced foundations to support the high levels of lead shielding required in the treatment rooms. This is both a very expensive and complicated process but the new facilities will provide better and better treatments.

TrueNTH Lifestyle Management Project, a Movember Initiative

Anne Breakey Hart recently passed along this interesting information from the **TrueNTH Lifestyle Management Team**:

It is a pleasure to write to you on behalf of the TrueNTH Lifestyle Management (LM) team about a **national wellness survivorship project** supported by **Prostate Cancer Canada (PCC)** and funded by the **Movember Foundation**. We hope to increase awareness about the project with PCCN groups.

One of the goals of the LM project is to ensure men have access to prostate cancer physical activity, nutrition and stress-reduction resources and programs to help them adopt healthy practices. **A** website and online portal has been developed which gives men access to personalized programs, trackers, tools, and health libraries of prostate cancer specific wellness resources.

Registration on the portal will connect users with the TrueNTH LM central team and allow them to sign up for **a 12-week home-based physical activity and yoga program**. Users can also choose to join the TrueNTH LM portal simply to track their health and browse the wellness resources without a formal program. Users can register at lifestyle.truenth.ca.

This promises to be a very exciting resource, given how important physical activity, nutrition and stress-reduction have been shown to be for cancer patients, both new and existing. We hope that many of our members and their supporters will take advantage of this. We can compare results at our September meeting!
