Our 12th Annual Cruisin' for a Cure Canada was a success. considering that September 9th was a cold and windy day. Some 400 vehicles came out and we provided about 260 free PSA tests. Pending receipt of the Dynacare invoice for the PSA tests. which takes months, it appears that we also did reasonably well financially. Our annual donation to Prostate Cancer Canada will be made at the Christmas meeting. Special thanks to all the volunteers who made this year's show possible.

Our October 9th monthly meeting deals with the subject of social isolation or loneliness. As we age, we can all suffer both physical and mental ills as we encounter normal health issues. our children leave home and our spouses pass away. The natural tendency is to withdraw from social contacts.

Our guest, the very dynamic **Peter Bombaci**, will introduce us to "The GenWell Project, a campaign whose mission is to make the world a happier and healthier place by reminding people about the importance of face to face human connection and inspiring them to take action. Human connection is the single largest indicator of happiness in our lives, reduces anxiety and depression, increases empathy, compassion and resilience and can make you live longer, it's just that most of us are doing less of it than ever before." Pete was inspired by the high levels of valuable social interaction that occurred after the 2003 power outage that forced people to connect face-to-face with the real people around them.


